

Refurbished facilities at Mearnsville All-Age

MEARNSVILLE, Westmoreland: THE ALMOST 200 students of Mearnsville All-Age School in Westmoreland are now enjoying the use of modern restroom facilities at the institution.

This was made possible through the vision of the Mearnsville/Auldry Community Development Committee and the assistance of local partners, headed by the Bluefields Bay Villa.

According to Debra Moncure of Bluefields Bay Villa, the project took just over 10 months to be completed at a cost of approximately \$1.5 million.

"What we have here are a male and female restrooms, completed with sinks, toilet stalls and urinals, which the students here will be happy to use."

A ribbon-cutting ceremony was held at the school last Thursday to commission into service the proper toilet facility. The function was
